

The Broughton Gifford Armistice Day Commemorative Community Supper

On the evening of Saturday, November 17th, nearly one hundred villagers, from the very young to the not so young, came together to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Armistice Day with an evening of food, entertainment and remembrance.

With the village hall decked out with poppies and flags, the evening began with a chance to absorb Rob and Kay Cummings' fascinating exhibition detailing everyday life for those left behind during the First World War, and the hardships and upheavals they had to endure. The exhibition had previously been on display in Melksham Town Hall and is now to tour several of the local villages. Rob has also pieced together biographies of all the men of Broughton Gifford who lost their lives in the conflict, which have been published in this magazine and have now been brought together in a book, a copy of which has been gifted to the village.

The entertainment then opened with poetry readings, and some poignant and hard-hitting pieces written by villagers Greta Land and Gayle Pearce, as well as some by more famous authors, read by Christopher Fielden. There was then a staged 'radio play' by Tim Cherry, which recreated his grandfather's first encounters with the brutal reality of the front line at the tender age of just sixteen. Performed by volunteers from the village, it really brought the senseless horror of battle to life.

To a background of music from the era, dinner got underway — a truly spectacular and delicious array of dishes, sweet and savoury, all cooked and served by volunteers. Guests were spoilt for choice — and for portion size! The courses were interspersed with further poetry readings, and with a sing song of old music-hall numbers of the era. It was a wonderful evening which struck a balance between feasting, fun, and a more sombre reflection on the tragedy of The Great War.



The Community First Wilts Community Oil Scheme

In 2012, as Village Co-ordinator, I first publicised The CF Wilts Community Oil Scheme and several villagers joined then and since, enjoying very competitive oil prices each time they placed a monthly order. The Scheme was slightly tweaked in light of experience;

- I no longer receive and collate orders for every member in the village; only for those who are not online
- the annual membership fee has risen from £20 to £24 for domestic customers (covering as many oil orders as you need)
- the interval between placing orders and delivery has been reduced. However, the minimum order remains 500 litres and ordering can be by e-mail, phone or hard copy.


The scheme is promoted by Community First, Wiltshire's rural community council (a respected charity) working in association with Oil Fuel Poverty Solutions, a social enterprise helping people facing fuel poverty. By combining the orders from across Wiltshire, keen prices can be negotiated, and savings are passed directly to members, as demonstrated by the price graph below. Consistently, the Scheme price beats even online. The Environment can also benefit; if one tanker delivers to several customers in a village on the same trip instead of making lots of individual deliveries, the fuel consumption and traffic in the village is reduced.

Scheme membership is also open to community organisations (£36 p a) and statutory organisations and businesses (under 5000 litres p a £36, 5000 to 10000 litres p a £72, over 10,000 litres p a £120).

**BROUGHTON GIFFORD PARISH COUNCIL REPORT
OF COUNCIL MEETING -**

14th NOVEMBER 2018

The November Council Meeting was attended by Cllr Martin Hooper (Chairman of the Meeting), Cllrs. Jonathan Barden, Jenny Freeman, Michael Griffiths, Claire Johnson, Henry Lumley, and Katherine Webb with apologies from Cllrs. Angela Andrews, Karen Hazlewood, Julian Robertson, and Mark Sullivan. The Chairman welcomed Jenny Freeman to her first meeting as a councillor.

The Council noted the Police Report and it was reported that a car had been broken into in Chalfield.

The next item was finance! All expenditure was agreed and the cheques were signed. The half-yearly accounts were also presented and noted by the councillors. There had been a query at the last meeting over the cost of the external audit. The Clerk reported that the External Auditor had not yet answered the Council's concern, but a copy of her letter had been sent to Wiltshire Association of Local Councils (WALC) who had agreed to take this up with the Nat. Assoc. Local Councils (NALC) and report back. Following receipt of a grant application form from Rob Cumming, for the costs to print the village War Memorial book, the Council unanimously agreed that they would pay for the first run of copies of the Memorial Book to be printed (Cost £113. 35) Rob has put a huge amount of work into putting this book together for Broughton Gifford. Copies may now be purchased from him. Email: rob@cybacat.com. One copy is being given to the Parish Council and we are looking forward to reading it! I Cllr Claire Johnson agreed to fill the vacancy on the Finance Committee.

Planning - there were no new planning applications this month. Cllr Jenny Freeman agreed to fill the vacancy on the Planning Committee. Cllr. Mike Griffiths also agreed to be Council rep to attend the

Melksham Area Board Meetings. So, as well as a full Council, Broughton Gifford has all its Committee and Rep vacancies filled.

The Clerk reported that she had taken up the problems of the "hard-to-use" pedestrian gates on the Norrington Solar Farm with the developers and would be meeting a rep on site to get them adjusted. Cllr. Johnson asked the Council to make representations about the obstruction on Footpath 8 as well and this was agreed.

The Minutes of the October Council Meeting were then approved. A site meeting to decide on the exact locations for the two new seats had taken place and, with the £500 grant from Melksham Area Board the Council was able to select two good quality seats to be placed in the Cemetery and in the Play Area. The Council also reviewed quotations for the new footpath adjacent to the new Cotswold Homes development and provisionally accepted a quote from Valletta Ltd subject to having timber edging fitted. Cllr. Hooper agreed to meet the contractor on site to iron out the details. The Council was also pleased to see that the new seat made from the felled London Plane is now in place near the phone box. Cllr Johnson gave a report of preparations for the forthcoming Community Armistice meal and it was agreed that any donations received would be donated to the Poppy Appeal. The Council also discussed the ponds on the Common. A resident has written to offer help with the Millennium pond and it was agreed to reply to ask for more detailed comments. Following discussion, it was felt best not to plant trees around the pond near the Stone Barn.

For the Play Area, there was again discussion about repairs to the slide. The Clerk asked for Council permission to sign off the 7-year Lease Declaration on terms that excluded normal security of tenure. The Lease has not limited future rent of the Play Area to a peppercorn, thus making it possible for a high rent to be charged in the future. There is also no photographic record of the poor condition of the slide at the time of takeover. It was agreed to

take up these items with Wiltshire Council, and to then sign off the Lease if a satisfactory reply is received.

The Council has taken delivery of five Oak trees from the Woodland Trust. At present these are not much more than twigs; too small to be planted individually and stand up to mowing in a public open space such as the Common. Malcolm Jarvis had offered to grow them on until they are a bit more sturdy and the Council agreed to accept this kind offer.

A very generous offer has been received from Brian Flynn of the West Wiltshire Ramblers Association to walk all 12 miles of footpaths in the village and waymark them. He has already obtained the waymark signs and all he has requested to do this work are some nails and a pruning saw. The Parish Council was delighted to accept his offer and the required items will shortly be purchased and passed on to him, maybe in time for us to see some of his work on our post-dinner Christmas day walks!

For highways, a site meeting is being held to decide on the exact location of our village gateways. These will be similar to ones already in place in the area, namely Atworth and Lacock, and are designed to slow drivers down as they enter the village. Alongside the Community Speedwatch initiative being organised by Cllr. Claire Johnson we are making excellent headway into making our village safer! The Council also agreed to pay one third of the cost to improve signage on the main road to stop HGV

traffic using Mill Lane. Following on from the Open Forum Highways Forum on 15th October, a letter from the school was received and it was agreed to respond to the points raised and emphasise that once the yellow lines and bollards are in place, the footway to /from the church will again be safe and usable for everyone, at all times. The Council is very grateful to St Marys School for hosting the Forum. It was so helpful to hear everyone's comments.

Since the Council Meeting on 14th November, the Community Meal has now taken place and it proved to be a huge success with £132.75 being raised for the Poppy Appeal! Our thanks to the Village hall Committee for donating the use of the hall free for the evening. We also wish to express our appreciation to all who volunteered to help both before, and during the evening and for all that delicious food. You did us proud! This special Armistice Commemoration night certainly brought out a lot of talent in our village: including some new poets and our own playwright. Thank you, Tim ! Thank you too Cllrs Claire Johnson and Angela Andrews for all your hard work and meticulous planning. And a special big thank you to all who came along, joined in the songs and made it so memorable.

Finally, from all the Council and staff to all of you – a very Happy Christmas! Stay safe, look out to make sure those who will miss loved ones are not on their own at this time and may you all be really blessed.
